Epistle Lesson: 1 Cor. 3:9-17

Brethren, we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder, I laid a foundation, and another man is building upon it. Let each man take care how he builds upon it. For no other foundation can any one lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any one builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw — each man's work will become manifest; for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. If the work which any man has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If any one destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and that temple you are.

<u>Gospel Mt. 14:22 – 34</u>

At that time, Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but the boat by this time was out on the sea, beaten by the waves; for the wind was against them. And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear. But immediately he spoke to them, saying, "Take heart, it is I; have no fear." And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, bid me come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus; but when he saw the strong wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "O man of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they entered the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." And when they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret.

Please note that there is a sophisticated email phishing scam targeting parishioners across our Metropolis and the Archdiocese. The scam involves a fake invitation, typically from punch bowl and looks like the following:

Shields Up: Guidance for Families

Every individual can take simple steps to improve their cyber hygiene and protect themselves online. In fact, there are 4 things you can do to keep yourself cyber safe. CISA urges everyone to practice the following:



Implement multi-factor authentication on all accounts

A password isn't enough to keep you safe online. By applying a second layer of identification, like a confirmation text message or email, a code from an authentication app, a fingerprint or Face ID, you're giving your bank, email provider, or any other site you're logging into the confidence that it really is you. Multi-factor authentication can make you significantly less likely to get hacked. Enable multi- factor authentication on your email, social media, online shopping, financial services accounts.

<u>Update your software</u>

Make sure to turn on automatic updates to protect your devices from hackers who exploit system flaws. Update the operating systems on your mobile phones, tablets, and laptops. Also, update all your applications, especially web browsers. Enable automatic updates for all devices, apps, and operating systems to keep them secure.

<u>Think before you click</u>

More than 90% of successful cyber-attacks start with a phishing email. A phishing scheme is when a link or webpage looks legitimate, but it's a trick designed by bad actors to have you reveal your passwords, social security number, credit card numbers, or other sensitive information. Once they have that information, they can use it on legitimate sites. And they may try to get you to run malicious software, also known as malware. If it's a link you don't recognize, trust your instincts, and think before you click.

<u>Use strong passwords, and ideally a password manager to generate and store</u> <u>unique passwords</u>

Use unique passwords for diJerent online accounts. In other words, use diJerent passwords for Netflix, Amazon, and Facebook. If an online service is compromised, you do not want hackers to gain access to the password to all your accounts. Our world is increasingly digital and increasingly interconnected. So, while we must protect ourselves, it's going to take all of us to really protect the systems we all rely on.



Transfer of the Remains of the Holy Apostle Bartholomew. The Holy Apostle Titus. Titus 1:1-5; 2:15; 3:1-2, 12-15; Mark 1:23-28

Today is the commemoration of the miraculous transfer of the remains of St. Bartholomew to the island of Lipara. His main feast falls on June 11.

Titus was one of the seventy apostles. Born in Crete and educated in Greek philosophy, he went to Jerusalem where he heard the words of the Savior. He was later baptized by Paul whom he served in the gospel as a son serves his father. Paul appointed him bishop of Crete and addressed to him the "Epistle to Titus."

A Pledge and Promise of Glory

The transfiguration looks forward to the Second Coming of Christ, when the Lord Jesus will appear once more in the same glory with which He appeared on Mount Tabor. With Him also at that time will appear the bodies of the saints, raised from their graves. They, too, will shine with the divine light that shone from our Lord on the mountain. Thus the glory of Tabor becomes a pledge and a promise of the glory of Paradise.

A profoundly important verse in 2 Corinthians 4:6 speaks of a process of transfiguration that is taking place within us: "God, Who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." Elsewhere St. Paul writes that "We with our unveiled faces reflecting like mirrors that brightness of the Lord, all grow brighter and brighter as we are turned into the image we reflect; this is the work of the Lord, Who is Spirit" (2 Cor. 3:18).

This transfiguration is taking place now through prayer and the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. Thus, the Transfiguration of Christ on Mount Tabor is extended in the life of the members of His Body, in us, foreshadowing the future resurrection of the dead when we shall partake of His glory.

Prayer

Jesus, when you come to judge the living and the dead, call me to stand at your right hand and bid me enter your Kingdom.
